Moist to wet soil, survives drought by going dormant. Early bloom attracts emerging bees and butterflies. Yellow Pond Lily (Spatterdock)	Nuphar lutea	5	6-24"	12-36"	36-60"		Perennial. Native to E. US, Eurasia. In the water lily family. Fragrant, globular, cup-like, 2 inch diameter flowers all summer. Each flowers partially opens in morning and closes at night, lasting about 4-5 days. Flat, oval/heart-shaped, lily-pad-like leaves float on the water surface. Shorter, cabbage-like leaves remain submerged under water. Spent flowers give way to seed heads that burst open when ripe, spreading their seeds over the water surface, reminiscent of dock (Rumex), hence the common name "spatterdock". Needs space, spreads by underground rhizomes, forms a colony. Dies back to rhizome in winter. Full sun to partial shade. Tolerates more shade and deeper water than water lilies (Nymphaea).
